The Volkmanns, like many of us, enjoyed wine with dinner, drinks with friends, beer and BBQs – alcohol was an everyday part of their lives. When their son Toren started drinking in high school, they struggled with how to respond. Toren’s drinking escalated in college without his parents realizing it, and spun out of control in the Peace Corps, where he was sent home. Hear how they eventually came to terms with the many elements that contributed to Toren’s addiction: an early start, family and community norms, campus life, cultural glamorization, and heredity. Discussing the complex role of alcohol in our families and society is challenging. Gain real-world insights into the complicated and sly role of alcohol in our lives and the impact it may have on our children.
